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
From the Manager's Desk:

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

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Permits 1-2-3!



Cabin fever got you thinking about sprucing up your home or property? Before you strap on the tool belt, be sure to take the proper measures to file your permit applications.

Do I need a permit?

As a general rule, if you plan to add something new to your home or yard, you'll need a permit. This includes (but is not limited to) outdoor structures such as:

Fences

Pools

Garages

 Roof replacement or repair (if more than 25% is being replaced)

Hot tubs

Sheds

Patios

Solar panels

Porches

Indoor projects that will need a permit include:

- · Additions/renovations
- · Addition of/changes to electric or plumbing
- Generator replacement

After you've determined that you do, in fact, need a permit, now what? Don't worry! We're here to help you through the process.

Step One: Request a permit packet

When you request a permit application, please provide the following information: name, street address, telephone number, email address, and the project/work you are planning to do. This will help us determine which packet of information you will need and which permit applications you will need to submit, as there are several different types of permits.

What is a "permit packet?"

To simplify the application process, East Fallowfield Township provides residents with "permit packets" that are customized for specific projects. If you are planning to add a fence to your property, for example, you will receive the fence packet which includes step-by-step instructions, a Zoning Permit Application, and insurance paperwork that must be filled out by your builder/installer. If you are doing a more complicated project, such as finishing a basement, your packet will include Building, Electric, Plumbing and Mechanical Permit Applications as well.

Step Two: Gather your information

To ensure your application is processed in a timely manner, please submit ALL pieces of the application at one time. Every permit packet will have a cover letter which identifies the specific requirements of the application. Please read these requirements carefully and follow all instructions. If you are unsure about how to fill out the paperwork, contact our office and we will be happy to help you.

Step Three: Submit your permit application

You may submit your application in person, by mail, or by email to dverderosa@eastfallowfield.org. The Township office is currently closed to foot traffic. However, if you come to our office during normal business hours, please drive around to the back of the building and knock on the Employee Entrance (sign says Visitors Please Knock Here). If you need to drop off the application when we are not here, you may use the silver drop box located on the outside of the building next to the Township Office sign.

What happens next?

The Township has 30 days to review and issue a permit. When we receive your application, we check to make sure all the pieces of information are included, and any plot plans or drawings are clearly marked. We will contact you if we need revised or additional information. Our building inspector will then review the application, and when it is approved, we will contact you to arrange payment and pickup of your permit.

When you receive your permit, a checklist of required inspections will be attached to the permit. Inspections may be scheduled by emailing your request to dverderosa@eastfallowfield.org or by calling 610-635-6077. Inspectors are available Monday through Friday, 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m. for inspections during the progress of work. Final inspections are conducted by the building inspector on Tuesdays and Thursdays, 9:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.

For certain projects a Certificate of Occupancy, or CO, is issued when the work has been completed and has passed its final inspection.

East Fallowfield Township Plants 34 Trees at the Township's Community Park

As part of the Township's Park Improvement Program, East Fallowfield Township completed the installation of 34 trees at the Township's Community Park this past fall. The trees were purchased and planted by a local nursery.

"The trees will provide a variety of benefits to the park's environment," said Township Manager Scott Swichar. "They bring beauty to our park as well as shade where you can cool off. They also help clean the air and make our community park a nice place to visit and relax," Swichar said.



The trees were acquired with grant funds from the PECO Green Region Grant Program and the Chester County Preservation Partnership Program (PPP). The Township's Board of Supervisors supported and approved the submission of the grant applications last year.

The Township's Park and Recreation Board assisted with selecting the variety of trees and choosing the location of the trees at the park. They chose a variety of native species, including the Sugar Maple, Black Gum, American Elm, and American Hornbeam as well as some non-native trees, such as the London Plane. "Having such a variety of trees is always a great defense against pests and diseases," added Swichar.

The Park and Recreation Board also provided a tree maintenance schedule to the Township. "Most of the tree maintenance and care will be handled by the Township's Public Works crew, so we appreciate the guidance on how to properly care for the new trees," Swichar noted.

The newly planted trees are 2-2 ½" caliper/diameter and approximately 8-10 feet tall. Most of the trees were planted near the paved trails, playground, and around the pavilion.



The year finished with a new ADA-accessible fishing pier at the park's pond, built by Dylan Florschutz for his Eagle Scout project.

East Fallowfield Township Park and Recreation Survey Results Released

We would like to thank the 216 residents who took the time to complete East Fallowfield Township's Park and Recreation online survey last year. The Township's Park and Recreation Board developed the 10-question survey using the online tool, SurveyMonkey.

"The purpose of the survey was to ascertain the community's satisfaction with current park facilities and gather input for future park improvements and recreational programming in the township," said Al Wright, chair of the Township's Park and Recreation Board. The Township's Park and Recreation Board is an advisory committee that makes recommendations to the Board of Supervisors regarding the improvements to the township's park and recreational programming.

The survey kicked off last summer and at the end of the survey period, the Park and Recreation Board conducted a public presentation to review the findings identified in the survey at the Township's Board of Supervisor's meeting.

Wright said people are generally happy with the Township's park, and that the survey showed that the park is heavily used by the community. "71% of survey respondents indicated that they or a member of their household are users of the township park and 41% of respondents reported using the park at least a few times a month," said Wright.

The trails, open space, and playground were rated as the park features that survey participants liked the most.

According to Wright, many residents indicated that they would

also like to see more walking trails, natural shade, and more active recreational options at the park such as basketball, tennis courts, or playing fields.

In terms of additional features residents would like to see added to the park, 42% expressed a need for more trails, 34% wanted a butterfly/bee garden added to the park, while 31% indicated they wanted to see the community pond stocked for fishing. Other new features that residents want to see at the park include decorative water features (24%), an additional pavilion (18%), and WiFi access (17%). A desire for decorative sculptures at the park ranked at the bottom of the list (only 4%).

"Despite the pandemic, many residents indicated that they would still likely attend certain outdoor events," said Wright. For example, 72% of respondents indicated that they would attend a farmer's market, 51% of respondents indicated that they would attend a food festival, 47% of respondents indicated that they would attend a drive-in movie, 38% indicated that they would attend a drive-in concert/tailgate BBQ.

"It's extremely important for us to know what improvements residents want to see in future park amenities, trails and programming so that we can make recommendations that reflect the needs of the community," concluded Wright.

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Free Electronics Recycling Program Continues

East Fallowfield Township has seen a dramatic increase since last March in the number of televisions and computers (e-waste) it has collected as part of its permanent electronics recycling program. "Township residents dropped off more than 570 old computers and televisions in 2020 compared to the 250 devices that were dropped off the prior year," said Township Manager Scott Swichar. Swichar attributed the surge to the effects of the global Covid-19 pandemic.

"When Pennsylvania went into lockdown back in March 2020 as a result of the pandemic, many of us found ourselves with more time on our hands as we stayed home," said Swichar. "During this time, we de-cluttered our homes in an attempt to keep busy during lockdown, and this included disposing of old electronics like televisions and old computers. Working from home also forced many of us to replace our old laptops and home office equipment in order to do our jobs more efficiently," Swichar said.

Despite concerns from many residents that the Township might stop the electronics recycling program due to the pandemic, the Township has been collecting e-waste since March of last year and plans to continue to offer the free program.

"East Fallowfield Township's program is one of the only year-round electronic recycling programs in Chester County that continues to provide e-waste recycling at no charge to residents. The Township's e-waste collection program is a crucial way to ensure that these potentially hazardous electronic items are properly recycled," Swichar said.

How Can I Recycle Computers, Laptops, TVs, Monitors, and Certain Electronic Equipment?

The Township's drop-off site is located at the Township Building (2264 Strasburg Road). The site is open weekdays from 8:30 AM to 4:00 PM, unless the Township is closed due to a holiday. No appointment is necessary, and the service is free. However, anyone dropping off electronics MUST first stop at the Administrative Office (please knock on the employee entrance door as the building is currently closed to the public) and show a valid ID or a copy of a utility bill identifying that he or she is a resident of East Fallowfield Township. Electronics may NOT be left outside at the Municipal Building or collection site when the facility is closed.

Acceptable electronic items include:

- Televisions
- Computers
- Laptops
- Cameras
- Cell Phones
- Calculators
- Typewriters
- Fax Machines
- Monitors
- Computer Keyboards
- Computer Mice
- Stereo Equipment
- VCRs
- DVD Players
- Small Appliances, like toasters, blenders, coffee makers, lamps, radios, hair dryers, window fans, hand-held power tools, etc.

Unacceptable items include:

- Any Freon containing appliance such as window air conditioners or refrigerators
- · Any fossil fuel or materials used in collecting fossil fuels
- Lead acid batteries
- Any infectious or biological wastes or equipment that contained them
- · Any media contaminated with oil
- Any liquid
- · Any chemicals, oils, or powders
- · Any equipment that contains chemicals of any kind
- · Any equipment that contains asbestos
- · Any equipment that contains radioactive components
- Any materials that are not integral to the original new equipment or otherwise associated with normal commercial or household environments that could adversely impact our operations or result in environmental or health and safety concerns

Reducing Stormwater and Flooding - What You Can do to Help

One of the best ways you can reduce the impacts of stormwater is to reduce the pollutants that can be carried in runoff into streams, reservoirs and water supply intakes. Always properly dispose of household hazardous waste, including cleaning solutions, paints, oils, batteries, solvents, pesticides, sealants, fertilizers, etc. When applying fertilizers or pesticides to your lawn or garden, only apply the recommended amount, and do not apply just before a rainstorm, or near a water body.

Disconnect your rain gutters: (downspouts) from impervious surfaces (such as driveways and sidewalks) and direct the flow to grassed areas or into infiltration beds (dry wells).

Install a rain barrel: and use the collected rainwater for watering flowers and gardens.

Allow a buffer of native grasses and other vegetation: to grow along streams, ponds, or wetlands. This will filter pollutants, protect the stream channel and bank from erosion, and provide better habitat for aquatic based animals.

Convert small low-lying areas into rain gardens: These can consist of small gardens of water tolerant plants and bushes that will help retain and infiltrate runoff.



Can damage equipment & are safety hazards. You may be able to schedule a bulky item pickup otherwise throw it in the trash or order a roll off bin by contacting Waste Management Customer Service.

Compost or put in your yard waste cart, if available. Otherwise it belongs in the trash.



NO NON-RECYCLABLE PLASTIC

Not everything that is plastic is recyclable! Recycle only food & beverage bottles, jugs and tubes.


